Chairman McBlain called on Mr. Madden to speak on our second Community Resolution by recognizing Earth Day on April 22.

Chairman McBlain called on Vice Chairman Morrone to recognize National Day of Prayer on Thursday, May 2.

Chairman McBlain called on Vice Chairman Morrone to start today's Agenda Items.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving Agenda Item 7, the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of April 3, 2019, seconded by Mr. Culp and carried unanimously.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving to Advertise for Request for Proposals to provide a Comprehensive Compensation Study. Discussion followed. The motion was seconded by Mr. Culp and carried unanimously.

Motion made by Mrs. Morrone approving Central Tax Collection Department's request for refunds for the years 2016 to 2019 County Real Estate Taxes for 14 property owners due to the overpayment of the amount of taxes due, seconded by Mr. Culp and carried unanimously.

PUBLIC COMMENT: <u>Margie McAboy, of Middletown Township</u>, commented on the Phoenix Study that was done on the prison.

John Butler, 208 Laurel Lane, Marple Township, commented on the results of the Study performed by the Phoenix Group on the George Hill Prison.

<u>Joanne Kelton, of the West Chester Committee to Reestablish Rail Service to the Borough (an ad hoc committee)</u>, asked for Council's endorsement of extending rail service from the Wawa Station (when that's completed) to West Chester Borough and to help fund the study.

Ruth Moten commented on the housing of the prisoners at the George W. Hill Facility.

<u>Kathy McCarey, accompanied by Police Officer Steve Russo</u>, spoke on a project that is in the planning stages to have a Law Enforcement K-9 Memorial built and with the hope it can be erected in Rose Tree Park.

COUNCIL: Mr. Zidek spoke about the Phoenix Report that Council recently received on the George W. Hill Prison.

Mr. Madden thanked the community that works everyday combating the opioid crisis and saving lives. He also commented on the Phoenix Study and how the prison is governed.

Mr. Culp wished everyone a Happy Easter.

Mrs. Morrone announced a conference that will be hosted by the Delaware County Women's Commission, Delaware County Economic Development Agency, Delaware County Commerce Center and the Delaware County Chamber of Commerce on May 13 from 8 A.M. to 2 P.M. at the Springfield Country Club to help elevate women who want to advance their careers and start their own businesses.

Chairman McBlain spoke on the Phoenix Report.
