

Coordinated Entry System in Delaware County

All services are accessed via the Coordinated Entry process

Coordinated Entry (CE) is a system level approach to connect people with a housing crisis efficiently and effectively with intervention that will rapidly resolve their crisis and facilitate housing stability.

The CE process is mandated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

In meeting this mandate, the Delaware County CE system aims to provide participant centered housing resolutions through assessments that evaluate vulnerability, severity of needs and housing barriers to resolve the crisis in a timely manner.

To understand the education rights of homeless children, consider the following points:

- The McKinney-Vento Act ensures homeless children have access to education.
- Schools must provide immediate enrollment, even without typical documentation.
- Transportation assistance is available to help children reach their school of origin.
- Schools must maintain the child's school of origin whenever possible.
- Local educational agencies are required to identify and support homeless students.
- Parents or guardians can advocate for their child's educational rights through local resources.

Our History, Mission & Governing Board

OUR HISTORY: The Homeless Services Coalition (HSC) is one of the longest standing coalitions in the County and has been coordinating homeless services since 1991. Over 100 members from both public and private organizations invest their time and efforts toward achieving an integrated community-based system of care which prevents homelessness, provides necessary support and opportunities to end homelessness.

OUR MISSION: The Homeless Services Coalition (HSC) exists to assist homeless people in Delaware County to become self-sufficient and to secure safe, affordable housing. The HSC promotes, coordinates, and supports the development of homeless programs that provide comprehensive services including Outreach, Shelter, Supportive Services, and Housing to homeless populations. Members of the HSC are committed to the development of close collaboration and cooperation among service providers, homeless people, funding sources, religious groups, businesses, government and interested members of the community.

OUR GOVERNING BOARD: Our Governing Board (GB) is the arm of the HSC that has been established to oversee and approve all aspects of the operation of the Delaware County Continuum of Care (CoC) as specified under the HEARTH Act; 24 CFR 578. Further, the Governing Board acts on behalf of the CoC using the process established as a requirement by C.F.R 578.7(a)(3) and in compliance with the conflict-of-interest requirements at 578.95(b). The GB is responsible for the approval and implementation of all CoC policies and procedures that include but is not limited to, voting on funding priorities, GB business, bylaw updates and HEARTH Act funding strategies or other matters that pertain to HUD CoC funding and programming.
